Will Jordan Lake Rules Affect You?

Following the Stormwater Phase II and Jordan Lake public forum, a citizen advisory group formed to discuss these environmental programs. This group has met several times in the last couple of months. As a focus, the group is attempting to identify financial and other impacts of the stormwater and Jordan Lake rules that will affect our City and Alamance County. The new rules mandate extensive stormwater runoff controls and will require the City to meet more stringent limits for wastewater discharge into the Haw River. As a result of these unfunded mandates some growth will be restricted and increases in utility rates will be required. City staff continues to monitor these environmental regulations and assess their impacts. Keeping citizens involved and aware of these concerns is important.

Holiday Fire Safety

With the holidays fast approaching, fires due to cooking, decorations, entertaining and home heating will be on the rise. The Burlington Fire Department wants to remind you of ways to keep your holidays festive and free of tragedy.

Nationwide, an average of 310 home fires occur when Christmas trees are ignited. These fires cause an estimated annual average of 14 deaths, 40 injuries and \$16.2 million in property damage.

Approximately 18,000 home fires were started by candles resulting in 130 deaths, 1350 injuries and \$333 million in property damage. Twice as many candle fires occur in the month of December than any other month. Decorations ignited by candles is the number one cause of these fires.

Please observe the following fire safety tips during the holiday season:

- Use flame-resistant, flame-retardant or non-combustible decorations when possible.
- Keep candles away from decorations and other combustible material and never use candles to decorate Christmas trees.
- When installing lights, follow the manufacturer's instructions for installation/maintenance.
- Carefully inspect new and previously used light strings and replace damaged items before use.
- Do not overload extension cords.
- Keep children and pets away from light strings and electrical decorations.
- Turn off all light strings and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.
- Never leave cooking unattended. This is the number one cause of home fires in the U.S.
- Smoke outside or provide deep-sided ashtrays.
- Properly dispose all smoking material.
- If smoking is allowed indoors, always check between and under upholstery and cushions and in side trashcans for cigarette butts that may be smoldering.
- Keep matches and lighters out of reach and away from children.
- Test your smoke alarms and let overnight guests know your fire escape plan.
- Have your heating system/chimney inspected prior to use.
